Amazing Africa!

Our new topic for this half term is Amazing Africa. We will be learning about the people, places, cultures and wildlife in Africa.

Reading

Pattern and Theme Poems

Find an simple African inspired poem either in a poetry book at home or on the internet. The poem could be by an African poet, it could be about a specific place in Africa or it could be about the beautiful landscape and wildlife.

Read the poem or parts of the poem out loud to someone in your family.

Objectives:

- Interpret a text by reading aloud with variety in pace and emphasis.
- Explore emotions invoked from texts.

Writing

Pattern and Theme Poems

Choose your favourite words from the African inspired poem that you have chosen. Write them down in an interesting way.

- Identify new or interesting words and phrases.
- Explore emotions invoked from texts.

Maths

Number - Place Value to 100 including counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Objectives:

- Count, read and write number to 100 in numerals.

Challenge 1

Find as many numbers as you can from 0 - 100 around your house or garden. Record the numbers that you have found and what they relate to. For example: 80 on a puzzle box. It tells me the number of pieces that are in the puzzle.

Challenge 2

For the numbers between 0 - 100 that you found around your house, write as many other facts about that number that you can think of.

For Example: 80 was on the puzzle box.

80 is 1 more than 79 and 1 less than 81. 80 is made up of 8 groups of 10. 80 is an even number because it ends in a zero. Try and think of as many as you can for each number.

Challenge 3

Write the numbers that you found in order from smallest to largest. Can you write any other similar sequence with the numbers in size order?

Science

Physical Processes - Light

Objectives:

- To be able to make a variety of comparative observations.
- To be able to identify and name a variety of man made and natural light sources.

Find as many man made and natural light sources as you can. You could find these around your home or use books or the internet to research them.

Present what you have found out in a clear way. You could use pictures, photographs or lists. Make sure that you can identify which ones are man made and which ones are natural. How can you tell the different between them? Discuss this with your family at home.

Cross Curricular Challenge

Amazing Africa - African Art

Objectives:

- To be able to describe shapes and patterns.
- To be able to describe what materials and techniques have been used.

African inspired artwork often includes many different repeating shapes and patterns.

Research some examples of African artwork in books or on the internet. Compare the ones that you have found and think about their similarities, differences and the shapes and patterns that they include.

Create your own African inspired piece of Artwork.

You can use your own choice of tools and materials to create your piece. You may want to use pencil drawing, paints, printing or a different media of your own choice.

When you have finished your piece think about describing what you have done and how you have done it and the shapes and patterns that you have used.

Can you make a second piece in a slightly different way and compare the two?
